

The Department of Religion at Princeton University, in conjunction with the Tikvah Project on Jewish Thought at Princeton, invites applications for a Tikvah Post Doctoral Fellowship in Religion, Ethics, and Politics.

We aim to appoint a postdoctoral research associate whose work grapples with questions at the intersections of religion, ethics, and politics from the perspectives of the Christian or Jewish traditions and who is committed to bringing these perspectives into conversation with the broader historical, philosophical, and theological traditions of the West and beyond. The field of Religion, Ethics, and Politics is defined here very broadly to include any relevant time period, figure, or topic. The postdoc will be integrated fully into the Department of Religion as well as into any and all appropriate programs and centers at Princeton University.

The candidate will pursue research and teach one course of his/her design each semester. This is a one-year position with the possibility of renewal for up to three years pending satisfactory performance. Salary and benefits are competitive.

Applications must include a cover letter, curriculum vitae, a statement (1000 words or less) describing the proposed research project, and a draft syllabus for a potential undergraduate seminar on Religion, Ethics, and Politics.
