Political Science postdoctoral fellowships: The Project for the Study of Liberal Democracy at Rhodes College invites applications for two post-doctoral fellowships made possible in part by the Jack Miller Center –Veritas Partner Program. The term of both fellowships is one year, beginning in August 2011. The salary is competitive and compensation will include college benefits for the 2011-2012 academic year. The successful candidates will have a teaching and research agenda focused on one or more of the following: western political thought and constitutionalism; American political thought; American political development. The post-doctoral fellows will be expected to maintain an active research and scholarly agenda and teach a 1-1 course load in the college's Political Science department and/or the college's signature humanities program: The Search for Values in the Light of Western History and Religion. In addition, the post-doctoral fellows may be asked to assist in other Liberal Democracy Project activities. Applications must include evidence and affirmations from the dissertation committee members that the candidate will have completed a Ph.D. by August 1, 2011. Completed applications will include a letter of application, a current curriculum vitae, a copy of graduate transcripts, a writing sample (chapter of dissertation or publication), syllabi, other evidence of teaching style and effectiveness, and three letters of recommendation.
